



Anchorage/Matsu Reentry & Recovery Linkage Initiative (ARRLI)



ARRLI is a coordinated *Request For Service* funding and resource navigation system that provides flexible, one time financial assistance and/or community resource navigation to justice-involved individuals with substance use disorders during reentry (post-release) from incarceration.

Funds can be used to cover critical, time-sensitive needs, such as transitional/housing fees, transportation, treatment fees, and basic necessities that support access to recovery, when no other community funding is available, based on applications submitted by workforce and provider advocates.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE SERVICES/FUNDS?

Adults newly or soon to be released from Incarceration, returning to Anchorage or Matsu Region, seeking support for recovery from substance or alcohol misuse, needing community resource guidance or who may be at risk of homelessness.

WHAT CAN THESE FUNDS BE USED FOR?

One Time/Urgent stability needs including: short-term transitional housing support, transportation, phones, treatment fees, short time phone assistance, identification documents or basic necessities.
