How the program works



The Anchorage Reentry Case Manager works with AKDOC and other community stakeholders from the Reentry Coalition to coordinate pre-&-post release access to services for medium-to high-risk reentrants determined by a current LSIR Assessment.



This is a short-term service over a nine-month period that begins in the AKDOC facility three months prior to release and continues for approximately six months after release.





Services and case management are provided by a designated Reentry Case Manager located at Partners Reentry Center in downtown Anchorage.



Participants in this program will utilize transitional housing placement and bridged funding, employment/job ready workshops, treatment and community referrals, transportation and supportive vouchers and other services provides at PRC with additional funding for behavior health/treatment support or other needs as determined between Case Manager and Participant.

HOW TO QUALIFY



- ✓ Release Date within the next 90 days
- ✓ Currently serving on a Felony Charge
- ✓ Recent LSIR score assessed at Med or High, OR have a Felony Sex Offense charge regardless of LSIR score
- ✓ Releasing into the Anchorage area
- ✓ Willing to reside in sober transitional housing, find employment or reconnect with social security benefits, while participating in a six-month Reentry program at PRC
- ✓ Please speak with your IPO or an Education Coordinator for a referral or for more information

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
