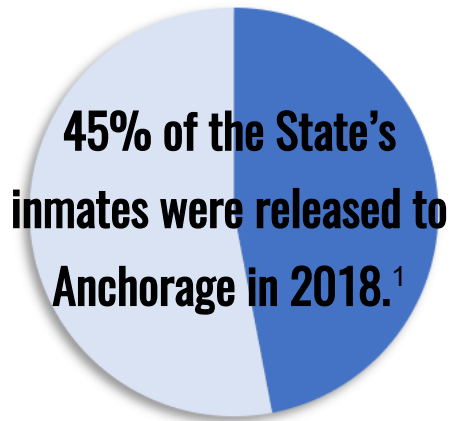


Prisoner Reentry Anchorage

84% of all releases to Anchorage in 2018 were for non-violent offenses.¹



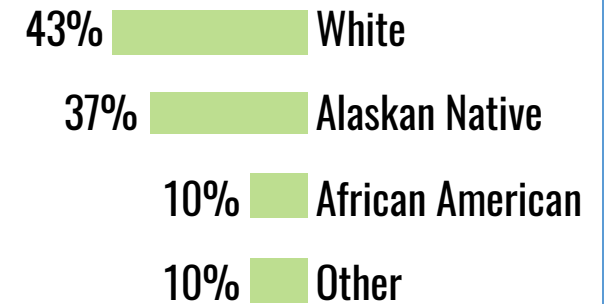
